Your 3-Day Ethiopian Canon Starter Plan

This plan is designed for 20–30 minutes per day. Each day builds on the previous one.

<p>Day 1</p> <p>The Foundation</p> <p>Read Genesis 1–3 from Volume 1A. Note what is familiar and what surprises you. Write 3 observations.</p>	<p>Day 2</p> <p>The Expanded Tradition</p> <p>Read the introduction to the Book of Jubilees (Volume 2A). Compare the creation account to what you read on Day 1.</p>	<p>Day 3</p> <p>The Living Tradition</p> <p>Read Psalm 151 (Volume 3A). Reflect on why this Psalm was preserved in Ethiopia but removed from most Western Bibles.</p>
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After Day 3

Journaling Prompts for Deep Study

These prompts are designed to move you from passive reading to active engagement. Use them after each study session.

4. What does this text reveal about the character of God that I had not considered?
5. How does understanding this tradition change how I read the books I already know?
6. What would I share with someone else about what I read today?
